

Thank you for taking part in the Vietnam Veterans' Family Study and being prepared to share your experiences of the effects of military service on you and your family.

The aim of the Study is to collect essential information to help us develop policies and programs for all members of the military community and their families. It is important we understand the experiences of ADF personnel who deployed to Vietnam and the possible impact of this service on their families. However, to fully understand the effects of their experiences, we need servicemen and servicewomen who did not go to Vietnam, and their families, to also take in part in the survey.
