Amberley has always been a popular posting preference, and your arrival coincides with the ongoing upgrades to the base. While well underway, you will see further re-development of the base which has to date resulted in increased infrastructure to accommodate new aircraft platforms, the arrival of 33 Squadron, Australian Army elements and a major upgrade to RAAF Security and Fire School (RAAFSFS) facilities. This year will see the relocation of 86 Wing and further infrastructure development.

Ipswich has a long association with RAAF Base Amberley, which continues to grow and strengthen. The base is an important part of Ipswich's identity and plays a vital role within the city.

What makes the Ipswich—RAAF Amberley relationship unique is the many lasting relationships we have built over the years with retiring RAAF personnel who have chosen to make Ipswich their permanent home. For those recently posted to Amberley, I encourage you to get to know your new home and to enjoy the many attractions and facilities Ipswich has to offer. These include a large number of free or low-cost family events like school holiday programs, movies in the park, and annual Christmas and New Year's Eve celebrations. We have a world-class library and art gallery, and over 500 parks where families can play and have a picnic or barbecue.

As one of the largest employers in the lpswich region, the base, which is also the largest operational Air Force base in Australia, contributes significantly to the lpswich economy.

The base at Amberley is growing at a rapid rate. The Federal Government pledged almost \$90 million in the 2010–11 budget for the base's expansion. The 21st Construction Squadron, 6th Engineer Support Regiment, relocated to Amberley at the end of 2010 with the Regimental Headquarters due to join them in the first half of 2012. They will join 9 FSB on Vung Tau Lines. And Ipswich City Council recently granted preliminary approval to the development of a \$150 million aerospace and defence precinct to be located next to RAAF Base Amberley.

This is also a momentous year as the Air Force farewells the beloved F-111 which is being retired. The new F/A-18F Super Hornet will replace the 'pig'. Ipswich residents have been lucky enough to watch the F-111s fly over the city for years, practising manoeuvres including the spectacular 'dump and burn'. These aircraft have a special place in the city's heart and will be honoured and remembered in a special exhibition at the Ipswich Art Gallery next year. In the meantime, Ipswich is proud to welcome the F/A-18F Super Hornets, their crews and families. Australia's first five Super Hornets flew into Amberley in March 2010, while another six arrived during July.

All personnel arriving at Amberley can expect a warm welcome from the Ipswich community. We are proud of our city and I trust new arrivals will also experience pride in Ipswich and the strong community spirit that gives our city a heart and soul.

After Hours Emergency Support

The DCO office is open from 8.30 am to 5.00 pm, Monday to Friday. All requests for emergency DCO assistance outside these hours and on public holidays should be directed to the National Welfare Coordination Centre (NWCC) on Tel: 1800 801 026.

NWCC will not transfer callers directly to DCO but, where necessary, will pass a request for assistance to a DCO Duty Officer who will return the call. DCO assistance out of hours is available in emergency situations only. Any non-emergency cases are referred for follow-up assistance during normal business hours.

RAAF Chaplaincy at Amberley

RAAF chaplains throughout Australia offer pastoral care: moral, spiritual and welfare services at an individual and corporate level to all serving members and their families. This includes referral to specialist agencies in the area

Chaplains are also available to marry, baptise and bury people, and the Base chapels are available for a variety of liturgical ceremonies on request. The RAAF Welfare Trust Fund is accessed via the Chaplains' Centre.

There is also a pool of RAAF Special Reserve Chaplains available by appointment, and selected civilian clergy in the area to serve all denominational needs.

A Duty Chaplain is on call at all times and is contactable through the base switchboard on Tel: (07) 5461 1111. The chaplains are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Army Chaplain at Amberley

The chaplain provides pastoral and religious care to soldiers and their families. His work begins with simply moving around and being friendly, available and visible. It extends to providing support at difficult times, such as relationship problems, death, serious illness or injury, work issues, and the 'tyranny of distance' in deployments and from the wider family. Part of his role is to be the soldiers' advocate with the chain of command, and to advise on how the Battalion deals with soldier and family issues in both specific cases and in general. Defence

RAAF Base Amberley is located only 8 km from lpswich along the Cunningham Highway, 50 km south-west of Brisbane. Travelling time from RAAF Base Amberley by car to Ipswich is approximately 10 minutes. Travelling from Ipswich to Brisbane by train takes approximately 45 minutes.

RAAF Amberley Units

Combat Support Group (CSG)

The role of CSG is to provide combat support services to all Air Force operational formations, and when applicable, ADF and Coalition Aviation formations. The services provided are varied, and range from engineering infrastructure through to navigational and tactical communications, air movement, airfield defence, health support, combat logistics, and personnel support capabilities.

The Amberley-based elements of CSG comprise:

Headquarters (HQ) CSG; HQ Health Services Wing (HQHSW); 395 Expeditionary Combat Support Wing (395ECSW); Combat Support Coordination Centre (CSCC); 382 Expeditionary Combat Support Squadron (382ECSS); No. 1 Airfield Defence Squadron (1AFDS); No. 2 Airfield Defence Squadron (2AFDS); 1 Expeditionary Health Squadron (1EHS); 23 Squadron and 1 Air Operations Support Squadron – Amberley (1AOSS-AMB).

Combat Coordination Support Centre (CSCC)

The CSCC was established in February 2007 to monitor and coordinate CSG activities, and act as a single point of contact for external

headquarters and agencies for specialist advice on RAAF Combat Support and for assistance in the planning and conduct of CSG support to operations, exercises, and directed activities.

Headquarters Health Services Wing (HQHSW)

HSW, an element of CSG is the RAAF specialist Health Wing. It consists of 1 Expeditionary Health Squadron (1EHS) at Amberley (detachment at Townsville), 2EHS at Williamtown (detachment at Tindal), 3EHS at Richmond (detachment at Butterworth and Darwin) and 4EHS at Edinburgh (detachments at Pearce, Wagga Wagga, Williamtown and East Sale). HSW provides all RAAF operational health capability and manages all sponsorship of Health Services Personnel

I Expeditionary Health Squadron (IEHS)

Under command of Headquarters Health Services Wing, 1EHS is responsible for providing a professional and responsive Expeditionary Health Capability in support of both RAAF and wider ADF operations both from home locations at Amberley and Townsville and from Areas of Operations.

Health Operational Conversion Unit (HOCU)

Under command of Headquarters Health Services Wing, HOCU is responsible for providing operationally focused health training for Air Force health personnel including tri-service and international aeromedical evacuation training. HOCU conducts and facilitates a wide range of Health courses at RAAF Base Amberley, RAAF Base Richmond and RAAF Base Townsville.

Amberley Health Centre (AHC)

Amberley Health Centre is a Joint Health Command facility and is responsible for providing medical and dental care to ADF personnel posted to RAAF Base Amberley. This support is also extended to ADF members visiting Amberley on course or deployment, and foreign military personnel stationed at Amberley on exchange, joint exercise duty or training.

No. I Airfield Defence Squadron (IAFDS)

1AFDS provides specialist individuals and collective very-short-notice-to-move capability ground defence and airbase protection to aircraft, installations and personnel in support of airpower and other directed ADF operations. The unit is capable of delivering a range of land-based close-combat effects, including physical security and protection, surveillance and precision engagement of adversarial threats. The unit is also capable of providing support to the civil community in times of crisis when tasked

1AFDS incorporates full-time permanent ground defence and part-time high-readiness reserve service personnel as an essential element of the Australian Government's Enhanced Land Force (ELF) within Air Force.

No. 2 Airfield Defence Squadron (2AFDS)

2AFDS is a rapidly deployable tactical unit tasked with a range of physical defence activities, including: the force protection and security of installations and assets; surveillance; early warning and providing quick reaction forces for bases and Air Force assets. The squadron maintains a short-notice-to-move capability and has supported United Nations peacekeeping and coalition operations overseas.

No. 382 Expeditionary Combat Support Squadron (382ECSS)

382ECSS is one of three Expeditionary Combat Support Squadrons in the RAAF. The squadron's role is to provide support operations at RAAF Base Amberley, and operational support to deployed RAAF elements on exercise or operations. The squadron includes a diverse range of musterings and categories, including: fire, catering, security, administration, logistics, ground defence, mechanical engineering, airfield engineering, physical training, information systems and explosive ordnance operations.

Headquarters No. 395 Expeditionary Combat Support Wing (HQ395ECSW)

395 has its HQ based at Amberley within Combat Support Group (CSG) and joins 396ECSW at Darwin and Health Services Wing (HSW) in providing Air Force with combat support services. Its roles are the Raise, Train & Sustain of the expeditionary combat support needed by Air Force on Operations. Its main task, supported by other CSG wings, is to set up, run and maintain expeditionary airbases to support Flying Squadrons. 395ECSW has eight subordinate squadrons: 1 Airfield Defence Squadron at Amberley, 2 Airfield Defence Squadron at Amberley, 381 Expeditionary Combat Support Squadron at Williamtown, 382 Expeditionary Combat Support Squadron at Amberley, 1 Airfield Operations Support Squadron at Townsville, 1 Combat Communications Squadron at Richmond, No. 23 (City of Brisbane) Squadron and No. 26 (City of Newcastle) Squadron.

No. I Air Operations Support Squadron (IAOSS-AMB)

1AOSS-AMB DET is responsible for the provision of air terminal support to RAAF Base Amberley, for operations, exercises and routine RAAF air transport. This support includes assistance for both civilian and military aircraft, managing aircraft loads and passenger processing services.

Air Combat Group (ACG)

ACG brings together the fighter and strike reconnaissance resources of the Air Force under one command. From its headquarters at RAAF Base Williamtown, the Commander ACG is responsible for the capability management of both the F/A-18 Hornet and F/A-18F Block II Super Hornet forces. The role of the Amberley-based ACG elements is to develop and maintain air strike and air reconnaissance capability.

No. 82 Wing (82WG)

82WG was formed in late 1944 and commenced operations in the Pacific as a heavy bomber wing on 11 February 1945. In the years since World War II, 82WG operated Lincolns, Canberra's and the F-4E Phantom.

Current day 82WG conducts effective strike, reconnaissance and forward air control operations through its units, 1SQN, 4SQN, 6SQN and 5FLT. It's arsenal of aircraft includes the P-C9 (located at 4SQN, RAAF Base Williamtown), Heron Unmanned Aerial Vehicle and the F/A-18F Block II Super Hornet.

No. 5 Flight (5FLT)

5FLT was formed at RAAF Base Amberley in January 2010 to develop and manage the delivery of Air Force's first Remotely Piloted Aircraft capability. 5FLT is currently conducting operations in Afghanistan.

No. I Squadron (ISQN)

1SQN formed in 1916 as part of the Australian Flying Corps, and it was the first Australian squadron to go into action in World War I.
1SQN is proud to be the first unit to transition to the F/A-18F Super Hornet and now operates the aircraft to provide a leading edge strike fighter capability to the ADF.

No. 6 Squadron (6SQN)

Formed in January 1939, 6SQN has its origins in Beauforts. After receiving numerous battle honours in the Pacific and New Guinea, 6SQN flew Lincolns after World War II, and

then entered the jet age in the 1950s – firstly with Canberra bombers, then F-4E fighter bombers, before the F-111C finally arrived on 1 June 1973. Today, the primary role of 6SQN is to train F/A-18F Super Hornet air crew to a mission-ready standard through the conduct of operational conversion and upgrade training.

No. 33 Squadron (33SQN)

This squadron was reformed on 1 July 1983 and operated the Boeing 707-338C aircraft until its retirement on 30 June 2008. 33SQN relocated to RAAF Base Amberley in July 2008 to prepare for the introduction of the KC-30A tanker aircraft into service.

No. 36 Squadron (36SQN)

Since its formation at Laverton, Victoria, in March 1942, 36SQN has been equipped with an assortment of aircraft, including DC 2s, De Havilland DH 86s, DC 3s, C130As and C130Hs. The squadron relocated to Amberley in November 2006 and began flying the C-17 'Globemaster' aircraft. Today, 36SQN continues to provide and re-invent heavy airlift capability for Australia.

No. 23 (City of Brisbane) Squadron (23SQN)

23SQN is responsible for managing the airfield and providing support to airbase operations at RAAF Amberley. In addition, 23SQN is responsible for Reservist pay and other specialist Reserve functions.

RAAF Security and Fire School (RAAFSFS)

RAAFSFS is the primary training facility for RAAF and Army Fire Fighters as well as Air Force Airfield Defence Guards, Security Police, Military Working Dog Handlers and Airfield Engineering personnel. The school provides the initial trade training for these musterings as well as some of the post graduate courses required for career progression.

Defence Support Group (DSG)

DSG is responsible for a range of base support services that are provided or coordinated through the DSG Manager. Services include personnel administration, access control, facilities maintenance, environmental management, ground maintenance, airfield and domestic fire services. DSG also provides procurement, registry catering and stewarding services.

No. 44 Wing Detachment – Amberley (44WG DET AMB)

44WG DET AMB forms part of Surveillance and Response Group, and is under the command of Headquarters 44 Wing, located at RAAF Williamtown. The Air Traffic Control component of 44WG, now known as JBAC (-Joint Battlefield Airspace Controllers), manage local and extended air-space and provide a safe and expeditious flow of flying aircraft.

44WG's Communications and Electronic Technicians (CETECHs) are responsible for the installation and maintenance of the radios, navigation and radar equipment which are essential to flying operations.

Air Force Improvement Team – Amberley (AFI AMB)

The role of AFI AMB is to support Force Element Group (FEG) Commanders and Directors involved in the Air Force Improvement Program. This is the program through which Air Force will deliver real improvements to Air Force capability, build more resilience in Air Force people and organisation, establish the required cost-conscious behaviours and deliver Strategic Reform Program (SRP) reforms and benefits. AFI consultants provide advice, assistance and education to those undertaking improvement projects under this program.

9th Force Support Battalion (9 FSB)

The role of 9 FSB is to provide force-level Combat Service Support to dependent force elements. 9 FSB capabilities are varied and include heavy road transport, air dispatch, amenities, pay and administration support, petroleum supply and refuelling, and field supply, distribution and warehousing. 9 FSB has sub-units or elements of sub-units located in Amberley, Brisbane, and Sydney. 9 FSB is one of the busiest, with some soldiers spending more than six months of the year deployed on operations, exercise or tasks within Australia. 9 FSB prides itself on being the Army's first choice to provide combat-ready and tradeproficient Combat Service Support soldiers within Australia and overseas.

6th Engineer Support Regiment (6ESR)

With an establishment of more than 500 regular soldiers, the 6ESR is the largest of the engineer regiments. 6ESR comprises the 1st Topographical Survey Squadron (1 Topo Svy Sqn) and the 20th Explosive Ordnance Disposal Squadron (20 EOD Sqn) in Enoggera, the 17th Construction Squadron (17 Const Sqn) in Sydney, the 21st Construction Squadron (21 Const Sqn) in Amberley, and the Regimental Headquarters (RHQ) which is currently in Enoggera, but scheduled to relocate to Amberley early in 2012.

The role of 6ESR is to provide engineer support to the Commander of the 6th Brigade at Regiment, Squadron or detachment strength. 6ESR also provides the Commander of the Deployable Joint Force Headquarters specialist topographic and engineer advice.

The role of 21 Const Sqn is to provide construction engineering support to a deployed force in order to support land, joint and specified operations for the defence of Australia and its national interests. Typical tasks include manoeuvre support (maintenance of force mobility within an area of operations), force protection (activities that enhance the ability of a force to survive enemy actions), and force infrastructure (the construction, maintenance and repair of infrastructure or facilities required to ensure force longevity in an area of operations).

No. I Combat Communications Squadron Detachment – Amberley (ICCS DET AMB)

1CCS DET AMB provides deployable communications support to the Squadrons on RAAF Base Amberley. This includes capabilities such as radios, data communications, and video teleconferencing.

Land 121 (Introduction into Service) Training Team (Land 121)

Land 121 – Project Overlander is an element of the Defence Material Organisation (DMO) and Army Headquarters (AHQ). The project will replace all the ADF's B vehicles progressively over the next decade. The Training Team, based in Amberley, delivers conversion training for vehicle operators and maintainers.

Education

Regional Education Liaison Officer

The Regional Education Liaison Officer (REDLO) can provide you with information and advice on the education system in your posting locality and the Education Assistance Scheme available through the Department of Defence.

The DCO booklet, *Education – Queensland*, is available from the REDLO and contains information about preschool, primary, secondary and tertiary education in Queensland. It also covers services available for children with special needs, information on changing schools and details of the Education Assistance Scheme.

Defence School Transition Aide

Defence funds Defence School Transition Aides (DSTAs) in a number of schools in Queensland. DSTAs (Primary) and Defence Transition Mentors (Secondary) are employed to assist families as they relocate to a new school.

They may:

- organise activities that welcome and farewell ADF families and help them settle into the new school community
- assist the school to understand the needs of ADF parents and their children

- inform the school and support families if ADF members are deployed
- help families with special needs
- assist families to collect work portfolios and academic records or reports for the new school
- act as a point of contact for ADF families in the new school.

The DSTA helps all Defence children at the school should they seek or require assistance. It is not intended that the DSTA work with one child on a long-term basis.

Employment

The Partner Education and Employment Program (PEEP)

Take a PEEP at your future

If you are a recognised partner of an ADF member, DCO's Partner Education and Employment Program, or PEEP, may be able to help you manage your career development.

PEEP Tier 1 provides an education and employment allowance of \$12,000 for a 10-year period to assist recognised ADF partners to better position themselves for employment through a range of initiatives when posted with the ADF member. Tier 1 is capped at \$6,000 per posting locality for assistance with: superannuation setup; professional employment assistance; child care, education and training; personalised resume preparation; and professional re-registration expense payments.

PEEP Tier 2 is an in-financial year 'one-off' payment of up to \$3,000 to be used for vocational courses, up to and including first-time undergraduate courses.

PEEP Tier 2 will be available for the next three years and is aimed at the partners of the more junior officer and enlisted ranks. Applications will be open to the partners of Private to Sergeant ranks (and their equivalents) and to the partners of Lieutenant to Captain ranks (and equivalents).

Tertiary studies assistance under PEEP

Partners are encouraged to undertake tertiary studies through Open Universities Australia (OUA). This allows partners to continue their education wherever they may be posted, whether in Australia or overseas. OUA offers the following benefits to Defence partners:

- access to an online enrolment facility and unique client code
- access to a priority corporate support team through a dedicated email contact point
- a dedicated 1300 number supported by a team to assist partners in making the right choice about higher education and government loan options
- a flexible international higher education study offer for clients no matter what their location
- financial support to each student who enrols using the code for the purchase of text books for the first five units
- extended online tutorial support.

Children's Services

Defence Child Care Program

The purpose of the Defence Child Care Program is to aid mobility by facilitating priority of access to child care for Defence families where the local community is unable to meet the demand for child care places. Accordingly, the program is focused on ensuring mobile Defence families can access some form of child care on arrival in the gaining locality. This is achieved through a variety of centre and non-centre-based child care. Defence does not directly subsidise the cost of any form of child care for Defence families, nor is child care an entitlement.

Defence Child Care Centres

There are currently 21 Defence child care centres across Australia that participate in the National Childcare Accreditation Council Quality Improvement Program. These centres are managed by B4Kids Pty Ltd and are required to meet the State/Territory Child Care Regulations for licensing and the requirements for the Child Care Benefit (CCB). The centres provide priority of access to Defence families in accordance with Defence's Priority of Access (POA) guidelines.

Special Needs

When Defence families with special needs are posted, they may have difficulties accessing the services they require. The problems families experience are due to the different eligibility criteria for accessing services, such as therapy (speech and occupational therapy) and respite, due to the lengthy waiting lists and, in some Instances, the lack of service providers. When relocating, some families require housing modifications and specific accommodation which caters for the additional requirements of the family member with special needs.

In order to address some of these difficulties Defence has a policy (PACMAN Ch 8 Part 6) that provides a range of assistance measures that can be accessed by ADF families who are formally recognised as having a dependant with special needs. The Dependants with Special Needs Program includes:

- a process whereby families have their status as a member with a special needs dependant formally recognised
- a process whereby families have the assistance required by the special needs dependant reviewed prior to relocating
- a special needs pre-posting visit
- assistance to access specialised equipment in the new locality
- assistance to access therapy services in the new locality
- assistance to access respite services in the new locality
- assistance with identifying appropriate housing and transit accommodation.

Contact your local DCO office for more information or request a CD ROM that explains the process for applying for recognition or, at the time of posting, to undertake an assessment of assistance required by the special needs dependant.

Children with Special Needs

The decision on where to enrol a student, and with what level of support, will depend on a number of factors, including the student's educational needs, the expressed desires of parents and caregivers, the capacity of the education system to provide the level of support services required at a particular location, and the availability of appropriate support services at alternative locations.

It is important that parents of children with special needs contact the REDLO as soon as notification of posting is given to facilitate the appropriate placement, so that the support required is available for the student from the time of arrival at the new school.


